A brief update on our PitchIn project. The aim is still to replace our pitch for the 2021/22 season.

A funding application has been submitted to the NHF – and —- hot of the press—we have just received notification from NHF that we have been awarded £50,000:)

So we are on the road, but still a long way to go

A further application will be submitted to Veolia in June, and then a further one to Sport England in due course.

We are hopeful that those applications could raise us @£150k, but it is early days. Funding is not the easiest of ways in the current climate.

Meanwhile we press on.

So far, in the club, we have also raised £42,151 towards our target of £220,000, through numerous club funding events—clubfest, dinners, youth events, Rugby World Cup, Bonfire night, Filipino night

Pitch Squares - we have sold 78 of the 640 squares, raising £1220 out of a possible £6,540) - we really need a big push, we still have a long way to go, has everyone bought a square? If not contact Alan for a Square!

Pitch replacement proposals - we currently have 2 possible suppliers and are looking at the best options.


We also have a proposal to install a Club embankment alongside the pitch which we are looking at.


Coaching Structure 20/21
