Restarting Cricket Guidance

There are a number of procedures that the club has to adhere to in order to get the game on this season. We ask that all members adhere to ECB Guidelines and Social Distancing rules.

Guidelines

Check for symptoms of COVID-19. If you are symptomatic, living in a household with a possible COVID-19 infection or if you are classified as extremely vulnerable on health grounds, you should remain at home and follow Government guidance.

If you have played in a match or attended a training session & subsequently display symptoms of COVID-19, you must inform the club immediately. It can then take steps to mitigate the risk to others and if necessary close the nets.

By playing matches, you are taking part at your own risk and the club will accept no liability for injury or infection.

Matches

Players must arrive for matches ready to play. Changing rooms will NOT be open.

Players must bring their own teas including drinks to matches. Teas will NOT be provided at home or away matches.

When travelling to matches, please follow government guidance (Safer Travel Guidance for Passengers).

No club equipment or access to club storage is allowed and players should NOT share equipment.

Players and scorers should adhere to social distancing guidance at all times except in the following circumstances during competitive play, where 1m+ is permitted: 1) wicket keepers standing up to the stumps and 2) distance between slip fielders.

Scoring in the scoreboard is allowed but limited to one person only. All equipment used must be wiped clean by each person who uses it.

There will only be one toilet in operation. Sanitiser and wipes will be available to clean the area before and after use.

Captains will ensure that players adhere to sanitation guidelines and take responsibility for the cleaning of toilet facilities.

During matches, play will stop and hand sanitising will take place every 6 overs. Please bring your own sanitiser to matches.

Players will NOT use saliva or sweat on the ball. The Umpire will also never come into contact with the ball.

All rubbish will be disposed of appropriately in bin liners. The captain will dispose of the rubbish accordingly.

Spectators must adhere to correct social distancing.
