

# Annual Report from CHA Youth & Schools - 2019/2020

# **Headlines**

The CHA Youth & Schools Committee still only consists of <u>three</u> active people! We really need willing volunteers for minor committee work or we engage more of the CHA committee in some roles. The CHA structure will be reviews if the AGM Resolution is passed.

Over the past year we delivered the Club & School Competitions and the Player Pathway however, the pandemic and lockdown impacted only at the end of the whole season, losing one AC training session, an AC competition day, 3 school tournaments and one club junior league day. The committee has decided to either cancel or rearrange each of the above as necessary. With affected clubs offered a credit note for next season on their entry fees.

## **Player Pathway**

## 1. Development Centres (DC)

We held three Development Centres in Bodmin, Truro and Pool, last May and June (2019) at U13 and U15, with a total of 182 players participating. We had sufficient coaches and welcomed some new faces to the coaching team.

### 2. Academy Centres (AC)

We continue to run the Cornwall at U14, U15 and U17 level for both boys and girls. These sessions run from October to April, with four competition dates for each age group.

We can report that 146 players took up places at the Academy Centre this season. This was higher than last year. We had particularly strong u15 girls, U17 girls and U17 boys. We continue to struggle with low numbers in the U15 and U17 boys.

## 3. Performance Centre (PC)

The number of Cornish players successfully selected for the West Performance Centres amounted to 7. With 23 players awaiting a PC assessment.

Notable successful Jacob Pengelly from Penzance joining the U16 England NAGS group.

### 4. Coaching

The committee would like to thank all the coaches that participated in the DC/ACs this season. We have a good pool of coaches and keep providing CPD opportunities for those interested in furthering their coaching. We ran an Academy Induction Workshop for all 18 Cornwall coaches as well offer coach bursaries to 3 coaches.

## **Junior Competitions**

#### 1. Schools

We have 18 schools affiliated to the Cornwall Schools & Youth. It would really help if clubs could engage with their local secondary schools in order to keep hockey on their curriculum.

We currently administrator 22 school's tournaments/festivals per season, these include girls, boys, mixed, 11 aside, 7 aside and indoor. We really appreciate the support from our schools, who host and administer these tournaments on the day, we couldn't do it without them!

We decided not to offer the Tier 3 (7 aside) competitions this season at U14 and U16 due to no demand from schools.

Congratulations to Truro High School being crowned National Champions in the Tier 3 England Hockey National Schools Championships!

#### 2. Clubs

We do wish to thank Caradon, Penzance and Truro for running the leagues as well as Falmouth and Bude for their support with the U16 leagues. Thank you to everyone who made these leagues a success!
