1. General Guidelines for all Participants

Prior to all cricket activity

- All participants (players, coaches, officials, volunteers and spectators) should check for symptoms of COVID-19. In line with current UK Government Guidance, if an individual is symptomatic and/or living in a household with a possible COVID-19 infection they should remain at home and follow UK Government guidance. In addition, any participants who have been asked to isolate by NHS Test and Trace because they are a contact of a known COVID-19 case, must not exercise outside their home or garden and must not exercise with others.
- Participants should follow UK Government guidance on shielding and protecting people who are clinically extremely vulnerable from COVID-19 ([found here](#)) if it applies to them.
- Participants should comply with all public health restrictions and avoid high risk behaviour outside the sports setting to reduce the risk to their fellow participants when they do attend a cricket club or venue.
- Personal hygiene measures should be carried out at home before and after cricket activity.
- Participants should bring their own hand sanitiser where possible and maintain strict and frequent hand hygiene measures at all times.
- Participants should follow UK Government guidance on best practice for travel, including minimising the use of public transport and limiting car sharing ([found here](#)).

- Eversholt Cricket Club representatives have ensured that facilities are compliant with current UK Government legislation including legislation and guidance related to COVID-19. A risk assessment has been completed and risk mitigation measures have been put in place and will be monitored in accordance with the ECB's guidance on [Getting your Clubhouse and Ground Ready for Step 4](#) or latest guidance received.
- This communication is intended to make all participants aware of expected social distancing and hygiene measures during play and whilst on site.
- In an effort to strictly limit the time spent congregating at our venue before activity begins please ensure that meet-up times reflect this. **Specifically, Participants should arrive changed and ready to begin the warm-up, if possible.**
- By way of this communication, Eversholt Cricket Club makes all participants aware of the increase in transmission risk associated with partaking in even socially distanced group activity and assumes that all participants are clear that they are opting to participate in cricket activity.

During all cricket activity

- Cricket activity must take place outdoors only.
- 11-a-side cricket can return as long as groups are limited to a maximum of 30 participants, including coaches and officials.
- Participants should enter the site and prepare their personal equipment whilst maintaining social distancing.
- Players should bring all of their own cricket kit
- Players should bring their own water bottle and any food / supplements from home
- Players should bring their own sunscreen, lip balm and towels from home
- Where possible players should limit sharing of equipment. If they do, they must practice strict hand hygiene before and after use and the equipment must be cleaned before use by another person. More information is available [here](#).
- No sweat or saliva is to be applied to the ball at any time.
- All participants should sanitise their hands prior to the start of the activity. Eversholt Cricket Club will provide facilities for hand sanitizing
- Hand sanitiser should be used at all breaks in activity and prior to consuming any food or drinks. Eversholt Cricket Club will provide facilities for hand sanitising
- Players should refrain from spitting or rinsing out their mouths.
- Eversholt Cricket Club will not prepare food for participants. Individuals should bring their own food and drink for 'teas' or practice. Water bottles or other refreshment containers should not be shared.

After all cricket activity

- All participants should sanitise their hands after the completion of activity. Eversholt Cricket Club will provide facilities for hand sanitizing
- Participants should exit whilst maintaining social distancing.
- Social gathering after the activity will be allowed in line with current UK Government guidelines on [hospitality](#) and social distancing must be maintained. ECB guidance is available [here](#)
- An Eversholt Cricket Club representative/volunteer will be responsible for collecting and disinfecting any shared equipment used by Eversholt Cricket Club participants and expects our opponents to take responsibility to do the same in respect of equipment shared by their participants. **There must be no sharing of equipment between teams**
- Regular cleaning of equipment and our facilities will take place, particularly between one group finishing, and another next group starting.
- Eversholt Cricket Club encourages all participants to report any infection of their household to the NHS Test and Trace system following use of the facility to limit the spread of the virus <https://www.gov.uk/guidance/nhs-test-and-trace-how-it-works>

2. Cricket at Eversholt Cricket Club

- Prior to reaching revised Step 3 of the [ECB COVID Roadmap V5](#) and subsequently re-opening, Eversholt Cricket Club representatives will ensure that their facility is compliant with current UK Government legislation including legislation and guidance related to COVID-19, and in accordance to the ECB's guidance on [Getting your Clubhouse and Ground Ready for Step 4](#) or later guidance received.
- A risk assessment has been completed and risk mitigation measures put in place and monitored.
- On any day of activity, Eversholt Cricket Club representatives and volunteers will ensure that all COVID-19 measures are in place according to the club operating and safety plans, whilst maintaining social distancing. This will include:
 - Set-up of public health operating procedures and access signage.
 - Set-up of cricket facility including all ground safety requirements including minimizing the number of people involved in setting-up / taking down stumps, boundary markers, etc.
 - Provision of gloves for moving sight screens during play
- The duty of care which Eversholt Cricket Club already owed remains and therefore other matters such as First Aid will continue to be provided. First Aid equipment and suitable PPE for First Aid will be available.
- Eversholt Cricket Club will make hand washing facilities and/or hand sanitiser available for all site users. Participants should wash hands regularly and for a minimum of 20 seconds
- Eversholt Cricket Club requests that, to the extent possible, participants ensure appropriate social distancing is observed during entry and exit, and whilst parking.
- Please see the attached ground plan and procedures for arrival and departure
- Eversholt Cricket Club will outline socially distanced areas for teams, officials, and spectators. Directions to these will be shared on arrival
- Eversholt Cricket Club will mark running lines on the square in line with the popping crease at 2m+ intervals on either side of the pitch.
- Eversholt Cricket Club will support NHS Test and Trace efforts by keeping a temporary record of all participants in any cricket activity for 21 days and support NHS requests for data if needed. In advance of any match, we request visiting teams to either share a full list of participants or confirm that they will maintain their own record as part of this process and make this available if required in line with NHS Test and Trace procedures.
- Players should adhere to UK Government social distancing guidance at all times (including throughout warm-ups) except in the following limited circumstances during competitive play in England only, where 1m+ is permitted:
 - wicket keepers standing up to the stumps and
 - distance between slip fielders.
- No sweat or saliva to be applied to the ball at any time.
- A 'hygiene break' should take place every six overs or every 20 minutes, whichever is sooner, in which the ball is cleaned with an antimicrobial wipe and all participants' hands are cleaned using a suitable sanitiser. This routine should also be followed at the start of any drinks break or the

close of an innings. The responsibility for sanitising the ball during the match will lie with the fielding captain, not the umpire.

- Batters to sanitise their bat when leaving the field of play and Wicket Keepers should sanitise their gloves.
- Bowlers should not hand any personal items to the umpire. Bowlers should place these items at the boundary themselves.
- Batters are to run in distinct running lines to ensure they are not within 2m of the bowler or other batter. Lines to be marked on the square on either side of the wicket.
- If two scorers are required, social distancing must be maintained with only one official inside the scorers' box and no players to be allowed in the scorers' box. The scorers' box should be well ventilated.
- Communal scorebooks passed from one player to another should be avoided.
- Social distancing must always be maintained including during post-wicket celebrations, drinks breaks and tactical discussions.
- Minimise sharing of the ball in a match by limiting contact as the ball makes its way back to the bowler e.g. ball goes straight from wicketkeeper to bowler instead of around surrounding fielders.
- Spectators should remain socially distanced at all times and refrain from all contact with the ball e.g. returning it to the field of play. Spectator groups must be restricted to discrete six person gathering limits and spread out, in line with wider UK Government guidance.
- Umpires should refrain from any contact with the ball, it can be returned to the base of the stumps at breaks and wickets.
- Umpires should be responsible for the stumps closest to them and should be the only person replacing the bails if dislodged.
- Eversholt Cricket Club Pavilion will not be in use other than to provide access to toilet / hand washing facilities to the rear of the Pavilion. Additional hand and equipment sanitizing facilities will also be provided
- Use of the toilets will adhere to the latest Government advice and be prepared in accordance with the ECB's previous guidance on [Getting your Clubhouse Ready for Step 4](#) .
- In the event of rain, participants should return to their own vehicle to maintain social distancing if there is insufficient outdoor cover from the rain to maintain social distancing.
- Application of covers in the event of wet weather should be done whilst maintaining social distancing.
- The traditional approach of collecting all the valuables and storing together in a single place (e.g. Scorebox) is not workable and contradicts social distancing, etc. Participants are responsible for their own valuables and these must be kept in isolation. ECC will not be providing any secure storage. Participants should minimise the valuables they bring to matches and make their own arrangements for security
- Match Fees: Skippers can decide if they (or their representative) are comfortable with collecting cash. If so, great. Normal process applies and the contactless payment system may be used if available and safely accessible on the day - Social distancing still to be maintained. If not then Skippers keep a detailed record of who has played and make it clear that payment will be expected at a later date. To be clear, this option is only to cater for the protection of those

collecting the money. If Skippers (or their representative) are happy to collect per Option 1, then players must pay and do not have an option to defer.

3. Transport for open Age Cricket

Where Eversholt Cricket club players are unable to avoid travelling with people outside of their household or support bubble they will, to the extent possible, adopt the following procedures to which we request visiting participants to also adhere :

- Share transport with the same people each time
- Keep to small groups of people at any one time
- Open windows for ventilation
- Travel side by side or behind other people, rather than facing them, where seating arrangements allow
- Face away from each other
- Consider seating arrangements to maximise distance between people in the vehicle
- Clean vehicles between journeys using standard cleaning products – making sure to clean door handles and other areas that people may touch
- Ask the driver and passengers to wear a face covering

Note regarding Junior Cricket

- Parents must arrange to transport their own children to and from all matches

4. Cricket at other Venues

Eversholt Cricket Club is committed to the health and safety of all participants and the broader community including the ongoing need to protect the NHS from an over-whelming “second wave”. As such, we undertake to support and comply with the procedures put in place by any host Club that we visit in the coming weeks and to work collaboratively to “get the game on” in a safe and enjoyable environment.

6. Cleaning Strategy and Procedures

A thorough clean of every touched surface will take place before or after opening every day.

Key touch points (such as toilets and handwashing/sanitising stations) will be cleaned and sanitised at least every hour. Surfaces and objects will be sanitised at least every hour and between each customer use.

Toilets:

Will be checked and cleaned regularly with signage (see below) in place to remind people of essential hygiene practice.

Facilities will be kept well ventilated, for example by fixing doors open, where appropriate.

Suitable handwashing facilities, including running water and liquid soap will be available.

Disposable paper towels will be provided for hand drying and safe waste management will be observed.

A record of cleaning will be maintained (see template below):

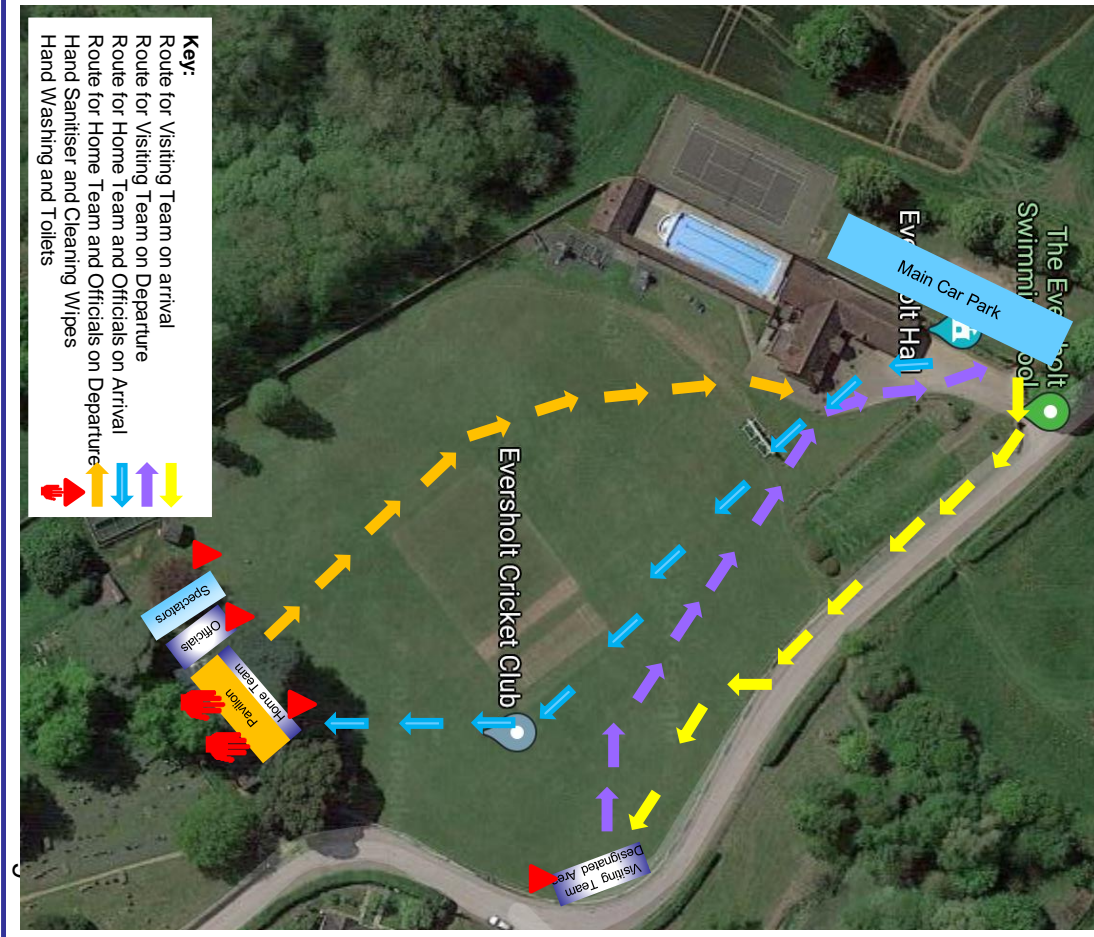

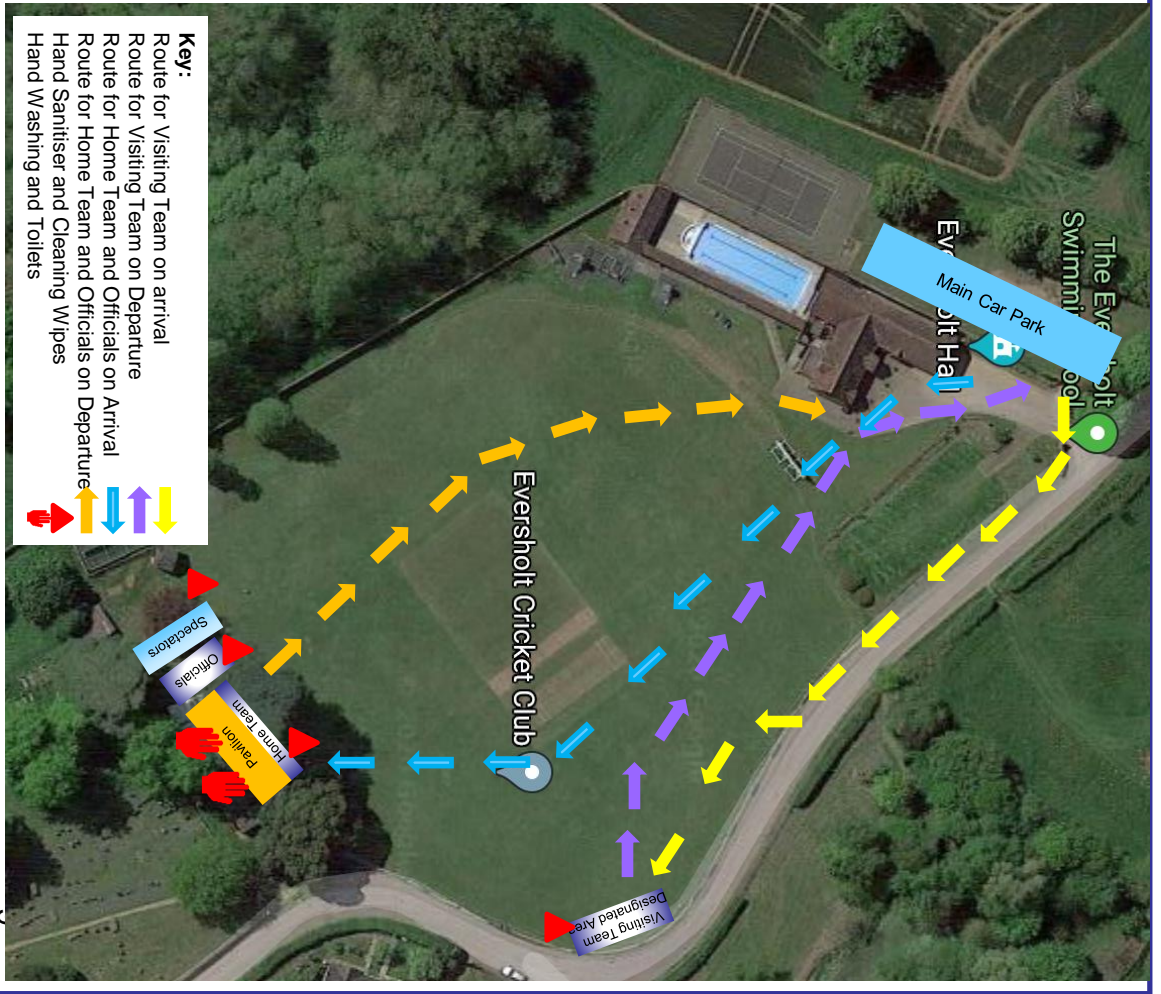
On Arrival

On Departure

11. Procedures for if a Participant Develops Symptoms

Everyone should have checked that they are not displaying symptoms before coming to the club but should someone start to show symptoms:

1. Maintain social distancing.
2. If the person is able to travel home safely they should travel home and manage their symptoms in accordance with Government guidance available here.
3. If the person is too unwell to travel home safely, they should be isolated from everyone else (Pavilion) and someone from their household contacted to make safe arrangements – if that is not possible then phone 111 and follow instructions.
4. Make sure that the isolation area is well ventilated and then cleaned carefully using suitable cleaning products and PPE in accordance

12. Communication Plan

Eversholt Cricket Club will provide regular communication to all Participants via all available media (written, email, social media) to ensure the safety of all participants and to help participants understand the procedures in place such that they know what to expect and do and in an effort to optimize the enjoyment of their visit.

All procedures and supporting guidance and documentation shall also be made available via the Club website at www.eversholtcricketclub.co.uk

Communications shall include but not be limited to:

- 1) Initial communication to all reasonably anticipated Participants (open Age and Junior) to share guidance and procedures in advance of the first Step 4 activity at Eversholt Cricket Club (see sample communication)
- 2) Sharing of Risk Assessment with Insurance Advisor
- 3) Sharing of procedures with Village Hall Committee
- 4) Provision of First Aid advice and guidance to all Club First Aiders
- 5) Specific communication to visiting Clubs in the days prior to their visit to ensure they are aware of their specific responsibilities and our procedures
- 6) On-going communications to Participants reminding them of procedures
- 7) Specific updates to Participants should changes to procedures occur due to a review of exiting procedures or receipt of revised guidance from Government or ECB
