You will also be invited to Heja. Heja is the app which we use to register attendance to training and for match selection. This must be updated 72hrs prior to each event and allows you to add a note if you are 'not going' with a reason why.

Training

Training is roughly scheduled every Wednesday or Saturday except half terms, Christmas, Easter and summer holidays. Other exceptions will be listed on our website.

You are required to attend every training session. Training is very important to develop and improve everyone's netball skills and for you to benefit from being part of a Club. We do try to have matches during the last part of training, which gives everyone good practice for the real thing.

You **must** book on to each training session via the Heja app no less than 72hours preceding the session/match. If your circumstances change after you have booked you must notify your coach. We understand that there are some weeks that you just can't make so please use the 'Not going' option on Heja and add a note of your reason why. **U11 Juniors** training is on Saturdays 10.45-12pm

Medical Matters

All Blaze NC Coaches have First Aid qualifications. Any member who has Asthma is expected to bring their inhalers to ALL matches and training. Junior member inhalers must be labelled with their names and GIVEN to the Coach or PLACED in a designated area for the duration of the session. The same applies to any member with conditions that may require Adrenalin Auto injectors or other quick response interventions.

Kit

At training you should wear your Club t-shirt, appropriate sports clothing and a specific sports bra should be worn during training and matches. We also recommend that you invest in a good pair of trainers, preferably netball or tennis specific ones. This is to increase the longevity of the sole as they are designed to withstand the 'wear and tear' caused by multidirectional movement on court surfaces.

Wearing kit helps you feel part of your team and part of the Club. As you are representing the club, for all matches you are required to wear our club dress which is available to purchase from http://blazenetballclub.bigcartel.com/. Items such as tracksuits, sweatshirts and socks are also available to purchase.

ENGLAND NETBALL

Codes of Conduct for Parents & Carers of U18s

Sporting excellence and enjoyment are only achieved by participants and spectators through adherence to the highest moral, ethical, and sporting standards. EN objective is to establish a safe, fair, and inclusive sporting environment. EN has Codes of Conduct across all aspects of the Sport, which promote respect, high standards of sporting behaviour and ethics to engage everyone in the Sport and provide them with an enjoyable, exciting, and stimulating experience. The enjoyment and safety of your child when they are involved in a netball activity is of paramount importance to EN. Every child will be encouraged and asked to ensure that their behaviour and actions meet the values and standards expected of them at all times. As parents, you are also asked to support our Codes of Conduct and embrace the spirit of our game.

As a parent/carer, I will:

- Encourage my child to play within the rules and respect officials' and coaches' decisions
- Support my child's efforts and performance, give positive comments that motivate and encourage continued effort and learning
- Understand that competition is about winning and losing, so results are always accepted without undue disappointment
- Be a positive role model to my child by helping them work towards skill improvement and high standards of sporting behaviour
- Remember that children learn best by example; I will applaud good play by both my child's team and their opponents
- Thank the coaches, officials and other volunteers who give their time for my child and not interfere with their decisions
- Help when asked by a coach or official
- Respect the rights, dignity and worth of all people involved in the game, regardless of gender, marital status, race, colour, disability, sexuality, age, occupation, religion, or political opinion
- Never engage in discriminatory abuse or anti-social behaviour which could include but is not limited to racism, sexism, antisemitic, Islamophobic, homophobic or transphobic behaviour
- Read the rules of the Sport to understand better what I am watching and discussing with my child
- Promote this code of conduct to other parents, carers, and supporters
- Be aware of my child's club safeguarding policy and ensure that any concerns are reported to the club's safeguarding officer or England Netball's Lead Safeguarding Officer.

As a parent/carer, I will not:

- Pressure my child in any way; I know that this is their Sport not mine
- Use inappropriate language, harass athletes, coaches, officials, or other spectators
- Criticise or ridicule my child for making a mistake or losing after the game
- Force my child if they are unwilling to participate in the Sport
- Use Social Media technology to bring the game into disrepute or make an inappropriate comment about an athlete,
 coach, official, volunteer or member of England Netball staff
- Arrive at a netball activity under the influence or consume illegal substances, alcoholic dirnks, smoke or vape either immediately prior to or while being at a netball activity where my child is participating in the Sport.

I will endeavour to abide by this code of conduct and promote it to others. I understand that if I fail to follow the code England Netball may take action against me under the Disciplinary Regulations which may result in Sanctions including suspension.

Codes of Conduct for Athletes

Sporting excellence and enjoyment are only achieved by participants and spectators through adherence to the highest moral, ethical and sporting standards. EN objective is to establish a safe, fair, and inclusive sporting environment. EN has Codes of Conduct across all aspects of the sport, which promote respect, high standards of sporting behaviour and ethics to engage everyone in the sprot and provide them with an enjoyable, exciting and stimulating experience. Our codes require the highest standards of conduct from everyone involved in Netball to ensure that their behaviour and actions meet the values and standards expected of them at all times. Everyone must conduct themselves in an honest, fair, impartial and transparent manner. EN Codes of Conduct are applicable to all aspects of the sport and are driven by England Netball's cultural behaviours and guiding principles.

Cultural Behaviours:

WE ARE PIONEERS: Never settling, continuously learning, and innovating to be the best that we can be.

WE EMPOWER: Through collaboration and trust we have confidence in ourselves and others to make the right decisions and get things done.

WE ARE PASSIONATE: Driven to succeed without ego, inspiring others along the way.

I Understand and will Respect:

- The rules, regulations and requirements of the Sport, including, but not limited to, any competitions in which I participate either directly or indirectly
- The rights, dignity and worth of all people involved in netball, regardless of any protected characteristic (age, disability, gender reassignment, marriage and civil partnership, pregnancy and maternity, race, religion or belief, sex, and sexual orientation)
- The rights, dignity and worth of Children, Young People and Adults at Risk and ensure that I am aware of the Safeguarding best practice guidelines and procedures when interacting with them.
- Confidentiality and the sensitivities of information I hold on other individuals
- Netball and the individual's reputation and not take any action or make inappropriate comments, including on Social Media, about a fellow participant, coach, official, volunteer or member of England Netball's staff that will bring the Sport or those associated with delivering the Sport into disrepute. I will respect EN's guidance and policies on social media technology.
- The position I hold within Netball and always conduct and dress myself in an appropriate manner.
- The result of the game and will not attempt to offer, offer or accept either directly or indirectly any consideration
 whatsoever in return for influencing or attempting to influence the result. I will not seek to achieve personal gain
 on a result which I can influence by betting on any match or event where I am participating, either by playing,
 coaching or officiating, or through direct or indirect involvement.
- That I must fully cooperate with anti-doping investigations or proceedings, whether conducted by UK Anti-Doping or any other competent body. Failure to do so without acceptable justification may be treated as misconduct under England Netball's Code of Conduct and may be sanctioned accordingly.
- In the event that I commit an act of misconduct that relates to anti-doping but does not amount to a violation of
 the Anti-Doping Rules of England Netball, England Netball may bring disciplinary proceedings against me for such
 misconduct under England Netball's Code of Conduct and they may be sanctioned accordingly.

Netball is based on Teamwork, therefore I will:

• Not abuse or misuse any relationship of trust or position of power or influence held by me in my team, be that my playing team, Club, County, Region or England Netball.

- Be on time, dressed appropriately and ready to give my full attention to the role I am carrying out within Netball.
- Recognise that individuals bring different qualities and attributes but "together we will excel".
- Welcome new members, volunteers, and connected participation and cooperate with Members, Connected Participants, colleagues, coaches, officials, and administrators already in the Sport.

I recognise individuals participate in Netball to achieve and have fun, therefore I will:

- Recognise the achievements of others and applaud their successes.
- Endeavour to ensure that all involved in the Sport optimise their potential by promoting the positive aspects of the sport and never condoning the use of inappropriate or abusive language, inappropriate relationships, bullying, harassment, discrimination, or physical violence.
- Follow the Guidance on Live Streaming Activities with Children and Adults at Risk whenever I am involved in Virtual Activity.
- Never engage in discriminatory abuse or anti-social behaviour which could include but is not limited to racism, sexism, antisemitic, Islamophobic, homophobic or transphobic behaviour.
- Not impinge on others enjoyment of the Sport or my performance by consuming alcoholic drinks, smoke or vape immediately prior to or while participating in the sport, or while safeguarding children, young people or vulnerable adults.
- Use Social Media technology appropriately, ensuring I do not bring the game into disrepute or make an inappropriate comment about an athlete, coach, official, volunteer or member of England Netball staff.
- Ensure that everyone has the opportunity to participate in a fair, honest environment by rejecting cheating, abiding by the Anti-Doping policies and not taking illegal substances immediately prior to or while participating in the Sport.
- Display modesty in victory and graciousness in defeat; be sporting whether I win or lose; always acknowledge the other team and the umpires at the end of the game with a hand shake or three cheers.
- Never argue with an official or participant during a game and listen to and cooperate with officials' decisions.
- Control my temper; I understand that verbal, emotional and physical abuse of officials, coaches, spectators or participants, or deliberately distracting or provoking a participant, coach or official is not acceptable or permitted behaviour in netball.
- Enjoy the game and ensure other can also enjoy it.

Blaze Netball Club Commitment Agreement



When becoming a member, all members are committing to the team ethos and positive culture of Blaze. Being invited to join Blaze is a real achievement, however, all players must understand the hard work starts from that point.

As a member of Blaze Netball Club, you are expected to commit to <u>all</u> training and games. You are also required to respond to Heja with your commitment to training and matches 72 hours prior. Your commitment is important for both your own netball progression but also a fundamental requirement to be in your squad. If there are unforeseen circumstances which mean you cannot attend, please ensure a note is added to Heja, explaining this, as well as, contacting your coach.

Lack of dedication, effort, open-mindedness or coachability are also unacceptable. Blaze is not just a club solely for training, fitness, or an after-school activity. Players must adequately prepare themselves for matches and training. This means making the right choices pre-game or training to ensure you are able to perform. This is also extended to parents/carers and supporters at training and matches. Please allow the coaches to complete their role, whilst you maintain your supportive position on the side line.

As coaches, we commit to you that we will work hard to help you improve your skills, enhance your knowledge of the game, and make practices a worthwhile experience. People very seldom are successful at anything unless they have fun doing it – enjoyment is throughout the Blaze ethos. We expect you to work hard, but in return, we will continue to try to ensure a lifelong love of Netball. As a coaching team at Blaze Netball Club, player progression and development underpin our training and match play opportunities. If you are unable to dedicate your time to ensure you are available for training and games, this hinders both your own, your team and the Club's progression.

We love the 'Blaze' passion and want to keep that alive in the club and in our players, hence our need for commitment to the coaches, the team, the Club, and yourself.

We believe that many good Netball experiences lie ahead of you as a member of Blaze Netball Club.

I will abide by the Blaze Netball Club Commitment Agreement and promote it to others.

By becoming a member of Blaze I agree, if training and/or games are missed, or there is continual lack of response on Heja, without valid reason, there is a possibility of my membership being reviewed. I agree that consistently arriving to Blaze inadequately prepared or late may also affect my position in a team and my membership.
